

David Hulme is Professor of Development Studies at the University of Manchester where he is Executive Director of the Global Development Institute (GDI) and CEO of the Effective States and Inclusive Development Research Centre (ESID) and Dams 2.0 Research Centre (DAMS2.0). He has worked on rural development, agrarian change, poverty and poverty reduction, microfinance, governance and public sector management, the role of NGOs in conflict/peace and development, environmental management, social protection and the political economy of global poverty. His main focus has been on Bangladesh but he has worked extensively across South Asia, East Africa and the Pacific. Hulme has consulted for the UNDP, World Bank, DFID, EU and governments in Asia, Africa, Europe and North America.

His recent books include ***What Works for Africa's Poorest?*** (Practical Action 2017), ***Bangladesh Confronts Climate Change*** (Anthem Press), ***Should Rich Nations Help the Poor?*** (Polity, 2016), ***Global Poverty: Global Governance and Poor People*** (Routledge, 2015), ***Governance, Management and Development*** (Palgrave, 2015), and ***Just Give Money to the Poor*** (Kumarian Press, USA, 2010).
